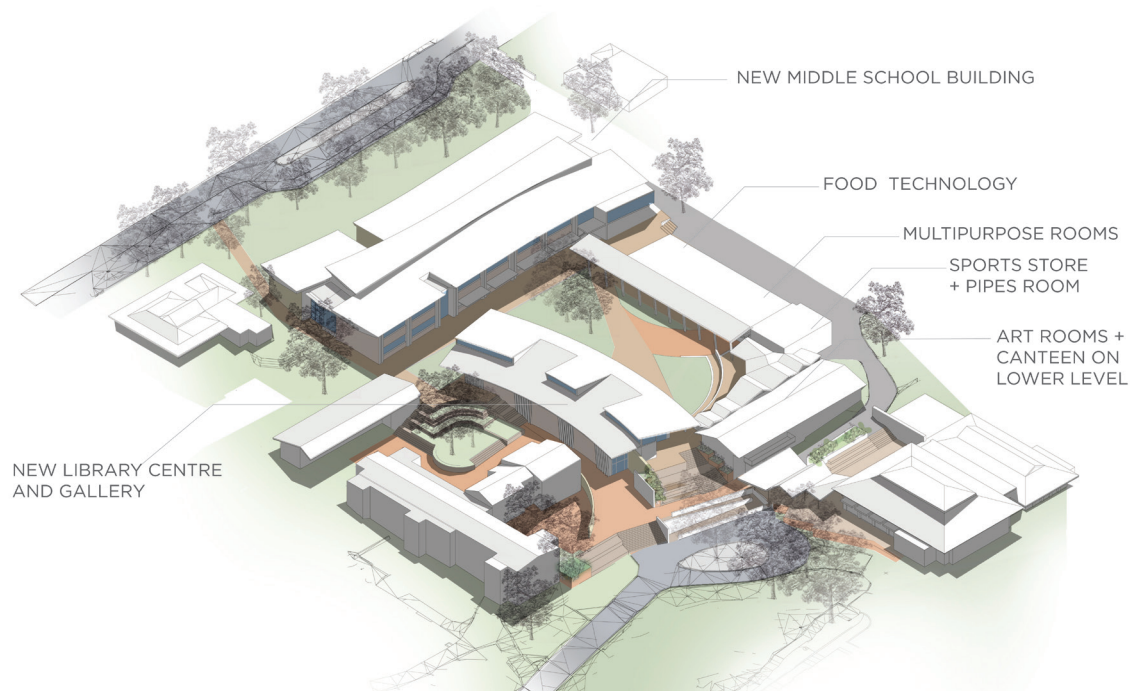
The Library, Research and Innovation Centre

Middle School

A time of transformation



From the ages of 11 to 14, boys go through one of the most dramatic periods of change in their life; intellectually, physically, socially and emotionally - every part of their being is undergoing transformation.

In recognition that boys need a safe, separate environment during this period of transition, Scotch introduced a Middle School programme in 2008.

Our innovative new Middle School building, which will house approximately 540 Year 6, 7 & 8 boys, is currently

under construction. To ensure the boys safety, we are also building an underpass beneath Shenton Road to connect the College's two main campuses. Both of these projects have been fully funded and are expected to be finished by December 2013.

However, in order to give boys every opportunity to discover where their strengths and passions lie, we believe it is important to complete our Middle School campus with a separate Library, Research and Innovation Centre and Gallery.
