JOB OVERVIEW

The Position

Scotch College has an exciting opportunity for a passionate specialist teacher to fulfil the role of Inclusive Education Teacher in the Senior School. This is a part-time (0.8FTE) maximum term position for Terms 2 and 3 2026, with the possibility of extension.

The role combines a 0.4 FTE load teaching one Year 10 ASDAN class and two Year 9 Cognitive Curriculum classes, with 0.4 FTE supporting the ongoing work of our highly regarded Inclusive Education team. Reporting to the Head of Inclusive Education (Years 6 to 12), the role will support the academic endeavours of Yr 10/11/12 boys with Learning Adjustment Profiles (LAPs), liaise with key stakeholders across the college and assist with organisation and study habits as required.

Our ideal candidate is an exemplary and committed practitioner with the ability to inspire students and promote personal development. Possessing appropriate postgraduate qualifications is desirable but not essential.

We are seeking candidates who:

- Demonstrate relevant teaching experience and strong knowledge of learning support and inclusive education; experience teaching ASDAN programs is highly desirable.
- Show a sound understanding of how students with a range of Specific Learning Disabilities (SLD) learn, and the classroom adjustments required to enable access to the curriculum.
- Have experience developing Individual Education Plans (IEPs) for students working on a modified curriculum and supporting subject specialist teachers to design IEPs and aligned curriculum resources that address individual learning goals.
- Possess knowledge of evidence-based interventions, strategies, and learning tools that effectively support students with diverse learning needs.
- Demonstrate the ability to consult, collaborate, and communicate effectively with students, parents, colleagues, and other staff.
- Possess strong digital technology skills to enhance teaching and learning, including accessibility and inclusive practice.
- Be willing to work collaboratively within a team, sharing knowledge and expertise to support inclusive outcomes.
- Exhibit highly developed communication, presentation, and teamwork skills.
