JOB OVERVIEW

The Position

Scotch College has an unique opportunity for a part-time College Accompanist - Teacher (0.5 FTE) to join our Performing Arts team on a permanent basis. The successful candidate will be employed as a teacher with relevant qualifications and registration with TRBWA, and will predominantly provide piano accompaniment for music students, teaching staff and ensembles for the purposes of classes, exams, assessments, rehearsals, and official performances and events, both on campus and off site.

The College Accompanist - Teacher will also work in an educative role, developing and mentoring student-pianists toward becoming student-accompanists and providing workshop opportunities for composition students to see their creations realised.

Candidates must be available to work flexible hours, including after school hours and weekends, with a degree of autonomy, as many performing arts events occur in non-standard working hours, including on weekends and during standard holiday periods

Music plays an important role at Scotch College, allowing students to express their identity and explore cultural values. Studying music also helps them engage with an ever-changing world.
